Dear Parent/Guardian:

This letter is being sent to the parents/guardians of students who are at-risk of failing one or more classes this year. Thornton Fractional Township High School District 215 will offer many special programs this summer that can help your son/daughter improve academic skills and earn needed credits.


I hope that you and your son/daughter will make plans to attend one or two of these special program sessions. It is important that students earn all the credits they need each year so they will not fall behind and be unable to graduate on-time. Please note that students will only be promoted if they have the required number of credits necessary for each grade level. I ask that you and your son/daughter make summer plans that accommodate summer school AND summer fun. We are counting on your cooperation and support.

The 2009 Summer School Program for Thornton Fractional North and Thornton Fractional South high schools will take place at the school district's Center for Academics and Technology (1605 Wentworth Avenue) during two, four-week sessions. Each session offers one full credit, and classes will be held Monday-Thursday from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. The cost of each session is \$100.

The first summer school session will be held from Wednesday, June 10 until Thursday, July 2, and the second summer school session will be held from Wednesday, July 8 until Thursday, July 30. Classes we expect to offer include: algebra, biology, English (9,10,11,12), geometry, health, physical education, U.S. History and World History.
