

(1996 BRFSS)



(1996 BRFSS, Age-Adjusted)










Percentage of High School Students Who Attended Physical Education Classes Daily, 1991–99







Can O.C. kids pass a fitness test?


To pass this posture and lower-back test, a student must complete a number of curl-ups:

Overall flexibility
