English 9 Honors Summer Reading Assignment

 Students enrolled in English 9 Honors must read TWO books. The <u>first book</u> is *The Wave* by Todd Strasser. This novel is about a classroom experiment that goes too far. The novel examines the powerful forces of group pressure that pervaded such movements as Nazism. Students will be evaluated on their summer reading during the first week of school. In addition, students must complete Reader Response journals for the book. The journal prompts are attached, and the journals are due the first full day of school.

SUMMER READING JOURNAL #1

• FIRST FEELINGS

What did you think of the beginning chapters? How do you feel about the characters? Do the first chapters bring anything to mind? What seems interesting or uninteresting? Respond to any or all of these questions. Feel free to add your own thoughts, feelings, and predictions.

SUMMER READING JOURNAL #2

ON YOUR WAY

Are the events in the reading clear to you now? How do you feel about the characters and the story now? Are you deeply involved in the book? Why or why not? What confuses, concerns, excites, or angers you so far? Respond to any and all questions. Add your own feelings or thoughts about the book.

SUMMER READING JOURNAL #3

• THE SECOND HALF

What seems important in the story now? What moves you, interests you, concerns you, or confuses you? If you were one of the characters, how would you react to the events as they have developed? Which character is most like you and why? Respond to any or all questions, and add your own thoughts about the book. Make a prediction: What will happen at the end of the book?

SUMMER READING JOURNAL #4

• A SUMMING UP

How do you react to the ending? How have the characters changed? In your opinion, who is the most interesting character in the book and why? What do you like most or least about this book and why? Do you think there is more to tell in this story? What do you think might happen next? Who else should read this book? Why? Who should not read this book? Why?

Respond to any and all questions, and once again, feel free to add your own thoughts and reactions.
