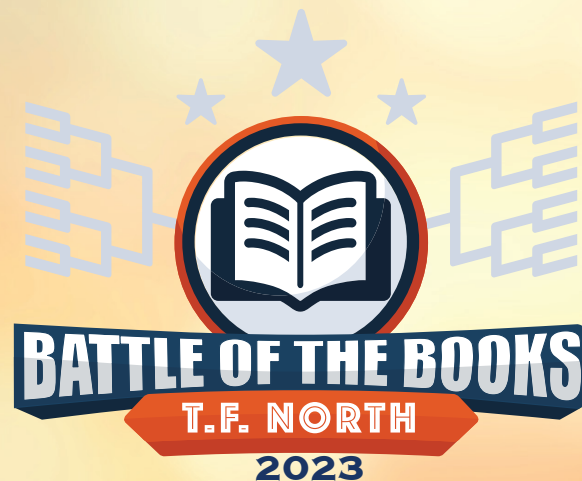
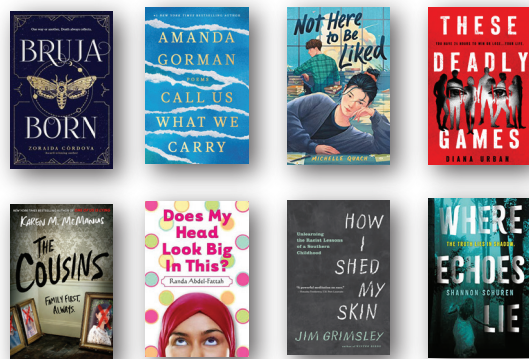

If you like thrillers, try *The Cousins*, *Where Echoes Lie*, or *These Deadly Games*.

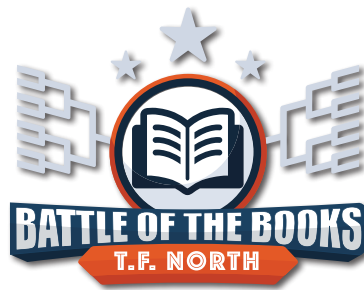
